JANUARY 27, 2019 - 3RD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

From the Desk of Father Jhakson

Brothers and sisters, this week, once again St. Paul speaks to us of the need of all to form the Body of Christ, which is the Church. Last week, we were told that unity must prevail over diversity; and the different services and activities, are given by the different talents that God gives us.

Saint Paul wants to remind us, once again, by using the example of the human body, that we are all necessary and that each one of us fulfills a specific function. As well as the body needs the different members, to be able to do all the necessary activities that it performs. And beyond that, there is something important that makes this reality possible: our baptism.

The baptism that we have received, breaks all the barriers and limitations that may exist: "Jews or Greeks, slaves or free", we form the Body of Christ. There is no social condition or race or border that is above what we have received from God.

That is why I want to invite you in a special way, to assume with greater dedication and commitment this call to develop your mission, united to the Body of Christ. We all form a single community, a family, that we want to carry the message that Jesus has come to bring and tells us in the Gospel: **"bring the good news to the poor ... announce liberation to the captives and healing to the blind, ... give freedom to the oppressed and proclaim the year of the Lord's grace"**. That is our mission, because when "a member suffers, everyone suffers with him; and when he receives honors, all, rejoice with him". Our community needs you because together we can do great things. Do not be afraid, do not make excuses. God has made you a member of his Body. Just decide.

Hermanos y hermanas, esta semana, una vez más San Pablo nos habla de la necesidad de todos para formar el Cuerpo de Cristo, que es la Iglesia. La semana pasada, se nos decía que la unidad debe prevalecer sobre la diversidad; y los diferentes servicios y actividades, se dan por los diferentes dones que Dios nos concede.

Y más allá de ello, hay algo importante que hace posible esta realidad: nuestro bautismo.

El bautismo que hemos recibido, rompe todas las barreras y limitaciones que puedan existir: "judíos o griegos, esclavos o libres", formamos el Cuerpo de Cristo. No hay ni condición social ni raza ni frontera que esté por encima de lo que hemos recibido de Dios.

Es por eso que quiero invitarte de manera especial, a asumir con mayor entrega y compromiso este llamado a desarrollar tu misión, unido al cuerpo de Cristo. Todos formamos una sola comunidad, una familia, que queremos llevar el mensaje que Jesús ha venido a traer y nos dice en el Evangelio: **"llevar a los pobres la buena nueva... anunciar la liberación a los cautivos y la curación a los ciegos, ...dar libertad a los oprimidos y proclamar el año de gracia del Señor"**. Esa es nuestra misión, porque cuando "un miembro sufre, todos sufren con él; y cuando recibe honores, todos, se alegran con él".

Nuestra comunidad te necesita porque todos juntos podemos hacer grandes cosas. No tengas miedo, no coloques excusas. Dios te ha hecho miembro de su Cuerpo. Sólo decídetelo.

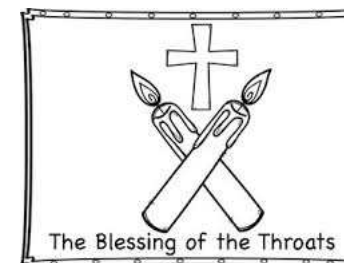
The nickname "Candlemas" results from our solemn blessing of candles for use in church and in homes during the year.
