

#### The Lion's Roar

Dear friends.

This Wednesday, March 20th is Be Reconciled Day. It is a day dedicated to having the Sacrament of Reconciliation/Confession/Penance available for the whole day, almost. If it has been years or months since your last Confession, you deserve peace and to be reconciled.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches: "Those who approach the sacrament of Penance obtain pardon from God's mercy for the offense committed against him, and are, at the same time, reconciled with the Church which they have wounded by their sins and which by charity, by example, and by prayer labors for their conversion." (1422)

Jesus, speaking to St. Faustina, said "Make your confession before Me. The person of the priest is, for Me, only a screen. Never analyze what sort of a priest it is that I am making use of; open your soul in confession as you would to Me, and I will fill it with My light."

Or as Jesus declared in Luke 15: 10, "In just the same way, I tell you, there will be rejoicing among the angels of God over one sinner who repents."

#### Reflecting on the Word:

Jesus cares for his friends and prepared them for his death. He knew that they would be sad, and that they would have a hard time understanding what was about to happen to him. To help them, Jesus spoke about a grain of wheat that falls to the ground and dies. Unless the seed dies, it could only be one small seed. But if it dies, something amazing and wonderful happens. From one little seed come tremendous growth. Jesus' words give us reassurance that death is not the end, and that God has the power to bring great good even out of moments of hurt and sorrow.
